- *Epacris acuminata* is a woody shrub that can be distinguished from other *Epacris* species at any time of year due to its distinctive foliage, but is most easily detected during its flowering period, July through to late October.
- *Epacris acuminata* grows in low shrubberies around rocky mountain summits, subalpine heathy woodland/forest, 'moist' dry sclerophyll forests and riparian scrubs. The species occurs exclusively on Jurassic dolerite, with a recorded altitude range of 30 to 1100 m above sea level.

Permit: A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
