**Endemic:** Found only in Tasmania

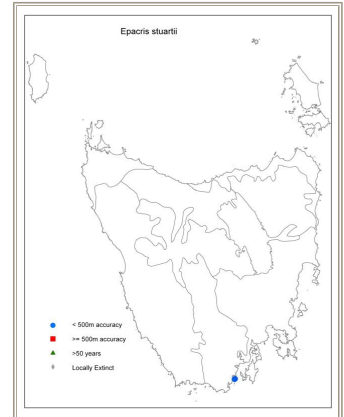

- Epacris stuartii* is best identified during its flowering period, from late winter to early spring, as flowers aid detection and enable confirmation of the identity of this small, erect or semi-prostrate multi-stemmed woody shrub. However, observations of this species have been made through most of the year.
- Epacris stuartii* is restricted to Southport Bluff, where it occurs in heathland on an exposed dolerite headland. Most plants occur in well-drained, shallow soils with others on rocky outcrops with either no soil, or small amounts of soil or moss.

**Permit:** A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
