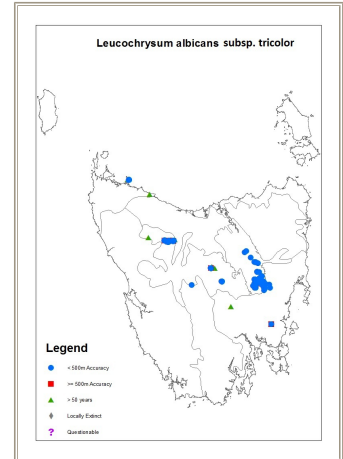

- Flowers are required to confirm the identity and aid detection of this perennial herb from the daisy family. Flowering occurs between November and January. Most herbarium specimens have been collected from mid-November to March. No other varieties of the species are known in Tasmania.
- In Tasmania, *Leucochrysum albicans subsp. tricolor* occurs in the west and on the Central Plateau and the Midlands, mostly on basalt soils. This species would have originally occupied *Eucalyptus pauciflora* (cabbage gum) woodland and tussock grassland, though most of this habitat is now converted to improved pasture or cropland.

Permit: A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
