Limonium australe var. *baudinii* tasmanian sea-lavender

Group: Magnoliophyta (flowering plants), Magnoliopsida (dicots), Plumbaginales, Plumbaginaceae

Status: *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995*: vulnerable
Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999: Vulnerable

Endemic: Found only in Tasmania

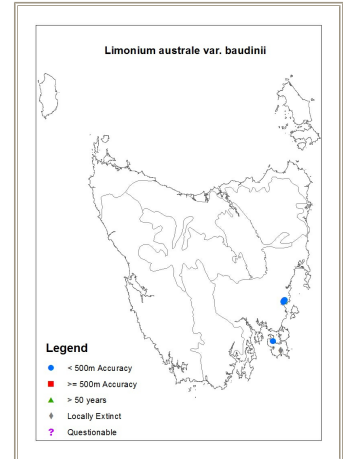


Limonium australe var. *baudinii* is a short-lived perennial herb in the Plumbaginaceae (leadwort) family. It is endemic to saltmarshes in southeastern Tasmania. The total population consists of fewer than 1000 mature plants. The species' habitat is at risk from drainage and land reclamation, eutrophication, mechanical disturbance and, in the longer term, rising sea levels associated with climate change.

- Flowers are required to confirm the identity and aid detection of this short-lived perennial herb. Flowering occurs from January to April, with material adequate for identification purposes being retained on the plant for a further month or two.
- *Limonium australe* var. *baudinii* is known only from the Triabunna area where it occurs in succulent or graminoid saltmarsh close to the high water mark, typically near small brackish streams.

Permit: A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
