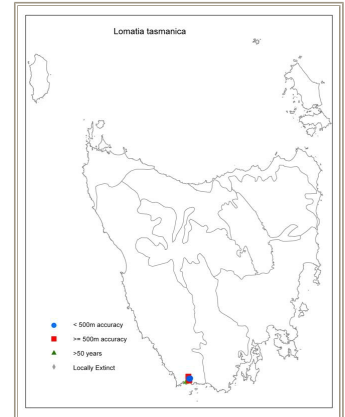
Endemic Status: Found only in Tasmania

- This distinctive small tree reproduces by root suckering and coppice only and can be identified at any time of the year due to its distinctive foliage. Flowers are sterile and have been observed to occur around January to February, though not annually.
- Lomatia tasmanica* is restricted to Southwest Tasmania where the only extant site extends over 1.2 kilometres in implicate scrub and mixed forest (containing eucalypts and rainforest species) in two deeply incised creeks separated by a ridge. It is suggested that the species favours gaps formed by disturbance from tree-fall.

Permit: A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
