Galaxias pedderensis Pedder Galaxias

Group: Chordata (vertebrates), Actinopterygii (bony fish), Salmoniformes (salmonids), Galaxiidae

Status: *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995*: **endangered**
Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999: Extinct in the Wild

Endemic Status: Endemic in Tasmania and restricted

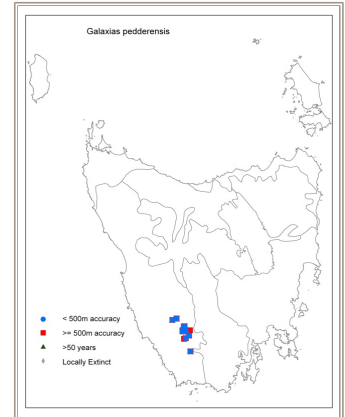


The Pedder galaxias is a Tasmanian endemic fresh water fish which was found only in the original Lake Pedder and related streams and pools in SW Tasmania. After the lake was flooded for a hydro-electric scheme its numbers eventually declined and it is now considered extinct in the area of its original distribution. Translocated populations have been established in Lake Oberon in the Western Arthurs and near Strathgordon.

The species is a slender fresh water fish growing to 170mm or more. Colour is light grey-brown with uneven darker patches. It is a benthic fish feeding primarily on invertebrates and probably spawning in smaller streams in spring.

Threats have come from loss of habitat and competition from introduced fish species.

Permit: A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
