Parvotettix whinrayi Whinray's Cave Cricket

Group: Arthropoda, Insecta (insects), Orthoptera (locusts, grasshoppers, crickets), Raphidophoridae

Status: *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995*: rare
Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999: Not listed

Endemic: Found only in Tasmania

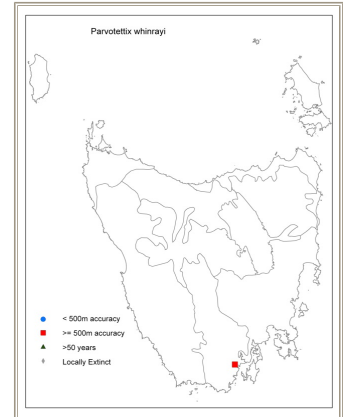
Status:

Whinrays Cave Cricket (*Parvotettix whinrayi*) is a small terrestrial cricket that occurs only on the Kent Group of islands in Bass Strait. It occupies near-coastal caves and under boulders on Deal, Erith, Dover and North East islands, and is reported from just 10 sites. There are no immediately identifiable threats to the species. However, factors such as illegal collection, possible competition with other invertebrates, predation by introduced rodents, climate change and stochastic events are considered as possible threats to the populations.

Permit: A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
