**Group:** Chordata (vertebrates), Aves (birds), Falconiformes (raptors, birds of prey), Accipitridae (raptor, hawk, eagle, buzzard, harrier, kite,)

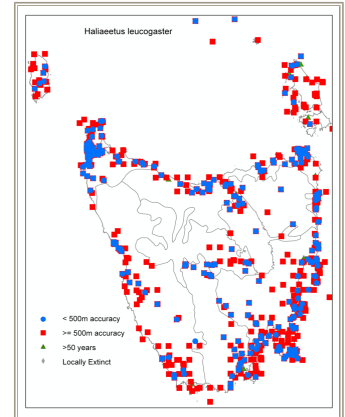
See however the profile for the Tasmanian Wedge-tailed Eagle: the requirements of the two species are very similar.

The breeding season of the White-bellied Sea-eagle is July to January inclusive, sometimes extending into February.

**Permit:** A permit is required under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* to 'take' (which includes kill, injure, catch, damage, destroy and collect), keep, trade in or process any specimen or products of a listed species. Additional permits may also be required under other Acts or regulations to take, disturb or interfere with any form of wildlife or its products, (e.g. dens, nests, bones). This may also depend on the tenure of the land and other agreements relating to its management.
